4-H Project Discovery Day

Project Discovery Day is designed to provide youth in 5-year old kindergarten and older, a chance to discover what they can learn and do in 4-H. During the day, youth can choose to participate in a variety of sessions that are led by 4-H adult and older youth volunteers and University of Wisconsin-Extension staff members. This event is open to all youth.

The first 4-H Project Discovery Day offered in 2015 will be held on Saturday, March 14 at the Tomahawk Middle School. Choose from exciting topics such as basketry, visual arts projects, creating a digital story, growing and propagat-

ing plants, origami, Kusudama, wildlife habitat, robotics and much, much more.

The overall event is free with only small charges for some of the sessions.
