Project Discovery Day is designed to provide youth in 5-year-old kindergarten and older, a chance to discover what they can learn and do in 4-H. During the day, youth can choose to participate in a variety of sessions that are led by 4-H adult and older youth volunteers and University of Wisconsin-Extension staff members. This event is open to all youth.

The next 4-H Project Discovery Day will be held on Saturday, Oct. 10, at the Lincoln County Service Center, 801 N. Sales St., Merrill. Choose from exciting topics such as basketry, numerous visual arts projects, sewing project, and much more. There is even a session for adult and older youth to learn about providing Science, Technology,

Engineering and Math (STEM) programs.

The overall event is free with only small charges for some of the sessions.
