The prestigious Key Award, one of the highest honors a 4-H member can receive, honors a select group of 4-H partic-ipants annually. The youth receiv-ing this award are ones who have demonstrated consistent growth in their 4-H involvement, devel-oped and applied their leadership skills, and actively participated in the functions of their club and their community. For the 37th consecu-tive year the Key awards are being sponsored by the Wisconsin Farm Burgay Ecurdation and Burgay In Bureau Foundation and Rural Insurance Companies.

I Dare You Leadership Awards

Rebecca Barkholz, a member of the Hi-Lo's 4-H Club, received the American Youth Foundation's National Leadership Award, in recognition of personal integrity, balanced living and potential lead-ership. The National Leadership Award is presented each year by the American Youth Foundation (AYF) in cooperation with principals, counselors, county 4-H programs, and other organizations across the country. The award was first of-fered in 1941 by the late William H. Danforth, founder of the Ralston Purina Company in St. Louis, who challenged young people to achieve their highest potential and to influ-ence others through lives of service. The award takes its name from the book, I Dare You, written by Danforth, in which he commends the balanced life of mental, physical, social and spiritual development as the backbone of leadership. In addition to a certificate of recognition each recipient received a copy of Danforth's inspirational book, I Dare You, and an opportunity to ap-ply for the "I Dare You" scholarship , which can be applied to the cost of the AYF's Leadership Conference located in Michigan.
