Project Leader Position Description

PURPOSE

Project Leaders work with a small group of 4-H members usually outside of the regular monthly club meeting to help them reach their learning goals in a specific 4-H project.

TIME REQUIRED

One year, approximately six meetings or more.

RESPONSIBILITIES

- 1. Support and encourage project members to reach their learning goals.
- 2. Establish a regular schedule of project experiences where members can gather to work on their projects.
- 3. Provide leadership for regularly scheduled project experiences.
- 4. Utilize project literature and other Extension supported resources to support project experiences.
- 5. Provide recognition to project members for the work they have accomplished
- 6. Offer parents suggestions on how they can assist members learning experiences.
- 7. Be flexible and take into consideration the age and ability of each child's individual needs.
- 8. Help members prepare for county fair and the judging experience.
- 9. Assist member record keeping.
- 10. Communicate regularly with the club organizational leaders.
- 11. Involve and delegate tasks to youth/teen leaders where available and appropriate.

QUALIFICATIONS

- 1. Enrolled 4-H adult leader who has completed Youth Protection Process
- 2. Willingness to work with any 4-H member, leaders or parent.
- 3. Ability to communicate to youth, parents, and other leaders.
- 4. Knowledge of the project area and willingness to update skills.
- 5. Enthusiasm.
- 6. Ability to cooperate and organize.
- 7. Willingness to delegate tasks to youth/teen leaders.
- 8. Willingness to listen and guide others.
