EIA Testing (Coggins) Equine Infectious Anemia



■ Equine Animals

- Negative EIA test for current calendar year
 - Unless exhibited on or before January 31 and documents a negative EIA test during the previous calendar year
- Show management
 - Keep EIA records for 5 years
- Statute 10.87 - Fairs & Exhibitions
 - 10.35 - General EIA information

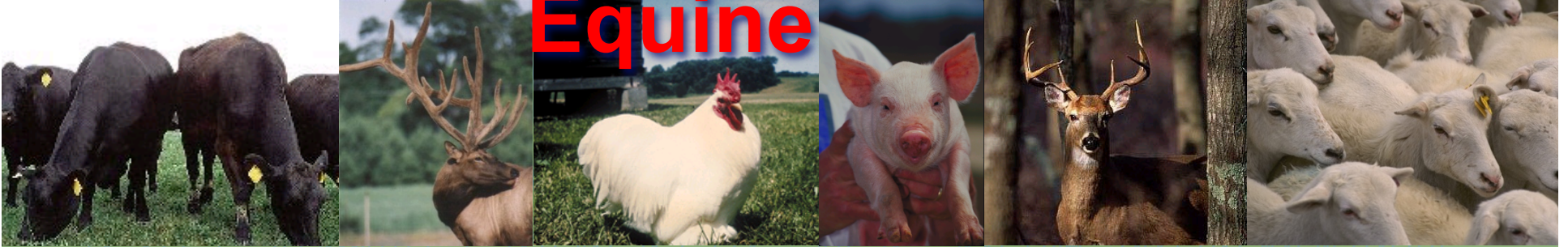
Fairs & Exhibitions:



- Premise ID
 - Noted on registration forms
 - Varies from county to county
- Additional Health Care information
 - Health Certificate
 - Vaccination records
 - Requirements vary county to county
- State Premiums
 - long term stabling at fair
 - Contact DATCP

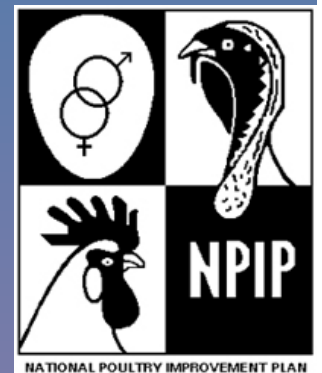

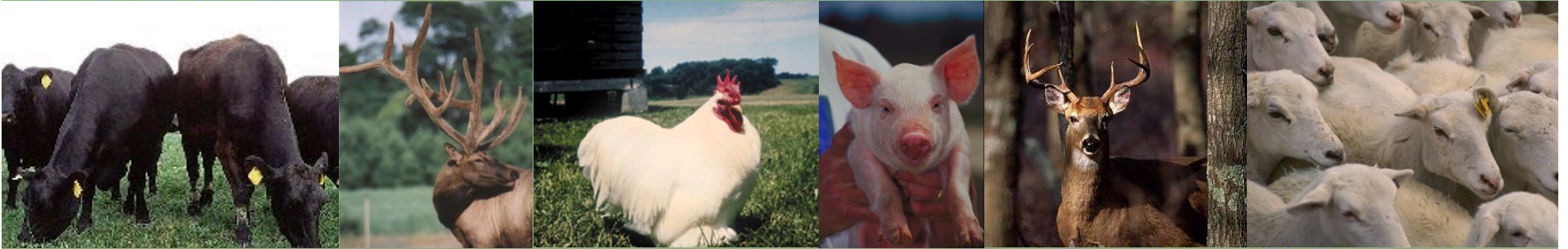
FAIRS & EXHIBITIONS



- Poultry must be compliant with ATCP 10.40
 - NPIP enrollment or NPIP affiliate flock
 - Wisconsin Tested flock or Associate flock
 - (From accredited hatcheries, if less than 4 months of age)
 - Individually tested negative for *S. pullorum*, fowl typhoid and, in the case of turkeys, *Mycoplasma gallisepticum* within 90 days



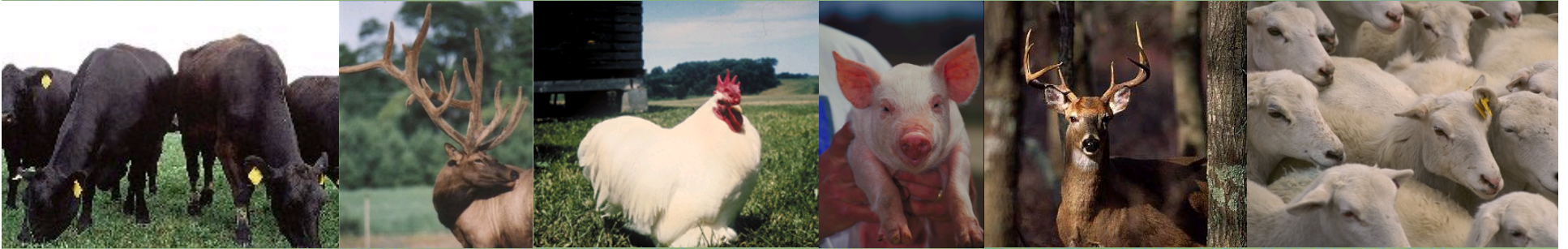
FAIRS & EXHIBITIONS



- Turkeys not to be commingled with other birds



OTHER HEALTH COMMENTS



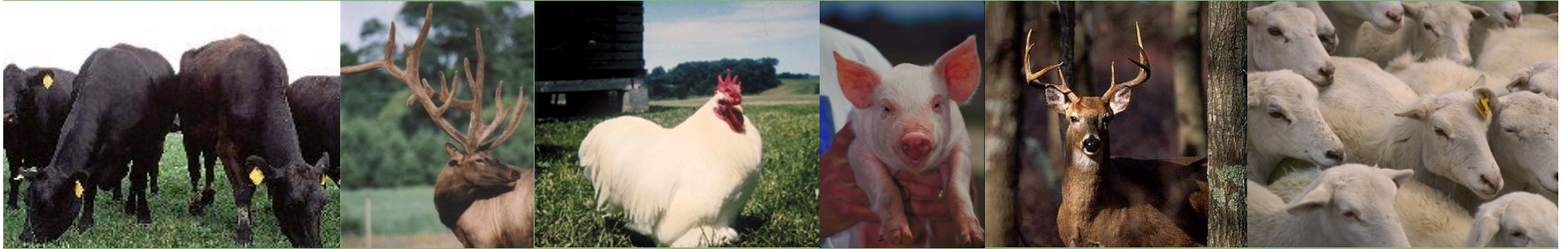
- Hand sanitizers / hand-washing stations for human health
- Heat stress
 - Ventilation / fans
 - Water
 - Night feeding
 - Send birds home early
- Good to encourage quarantine when birds are taken home

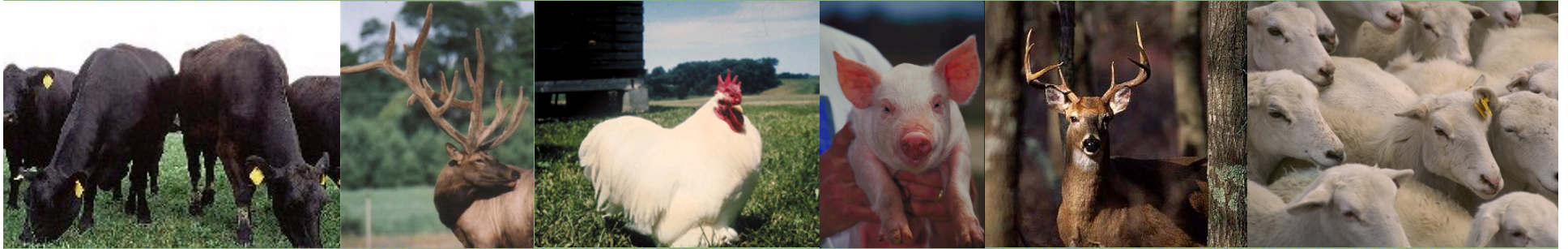
Fair Organizer

- Obtain, review and keep required records
- Keep records 5 years
- Make records available upon request



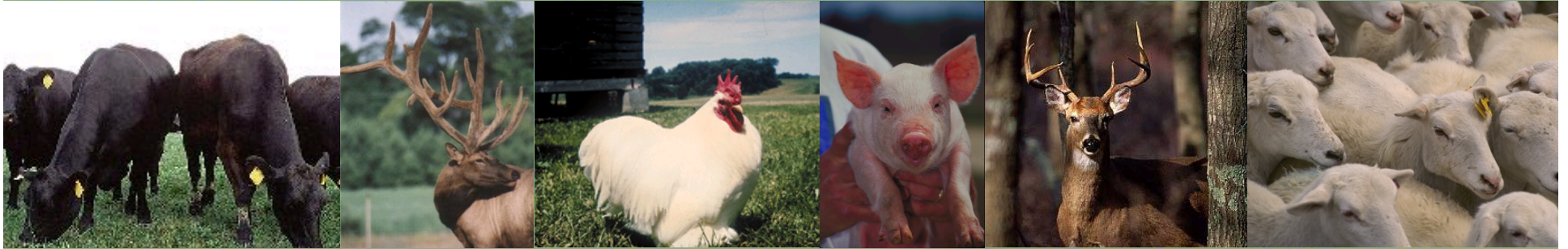
Fair Organizer

- If fair lasts more than 24 hours; Appoint Veterinarian
 - Conduct daily inspection
 - Review health records



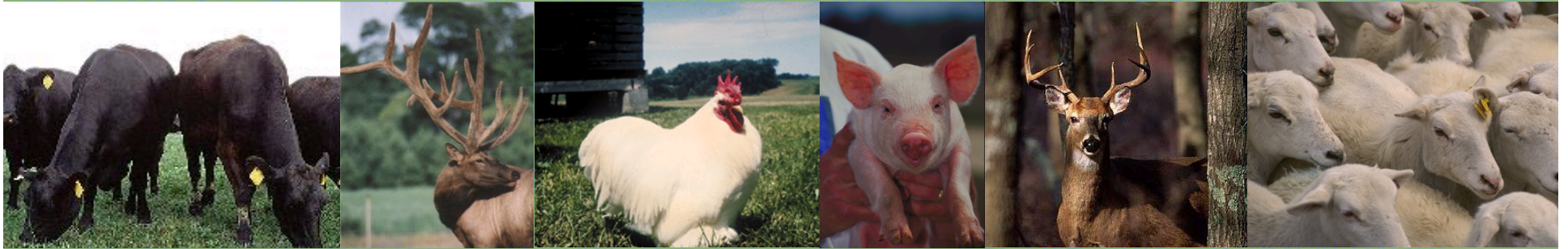
Exhibitor Requirements

- Comply with movement requirements
- Provide to Organizer:
 - Name and Address
 - Identification of Animals, number, type and description



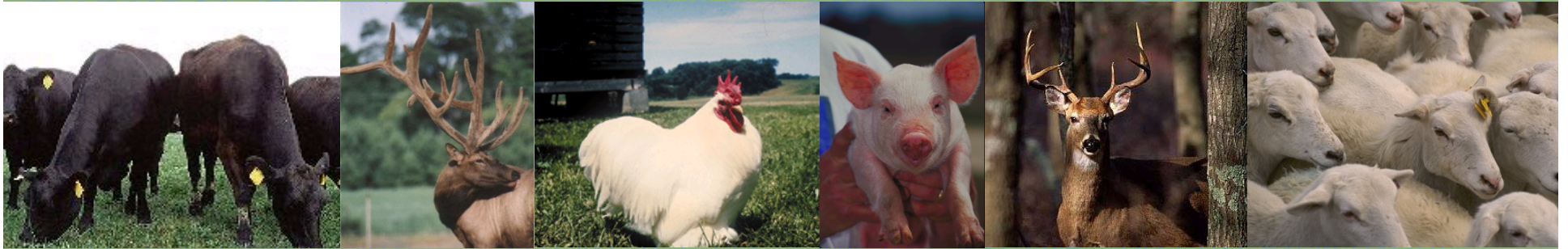
Exhibitor Requirements

- Documents to show disease testing and health requirements
- Livestock premises code, if any
- If applicable documents to show animals were imported legally



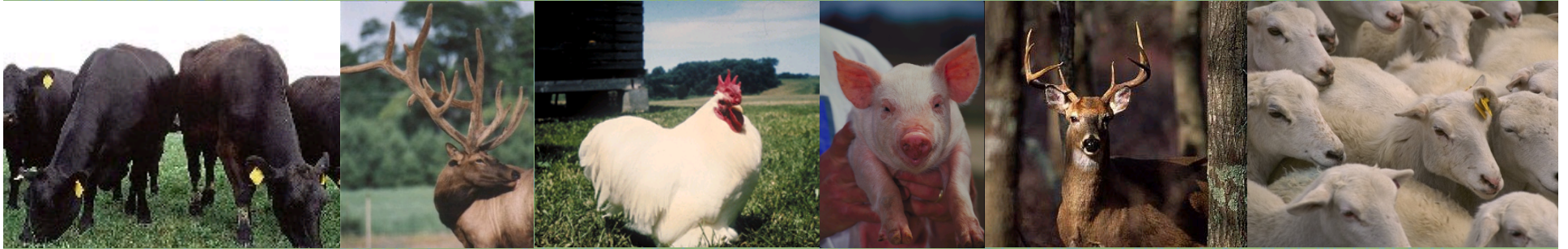
Bovine Requirements

- Bovine Animals infected with mange, scab, ringworm, or warts may not be exhibited unless the veterinarian in charge says the lesions are inactive and not capable of transmitting the disease.



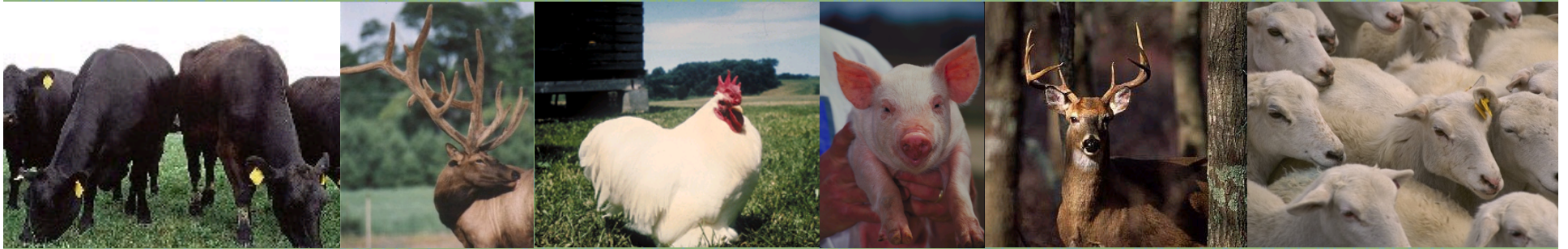
Sheep

- Sheep must bear an official individual identification unless it is:
 - A neutered sheep under 12 months of age



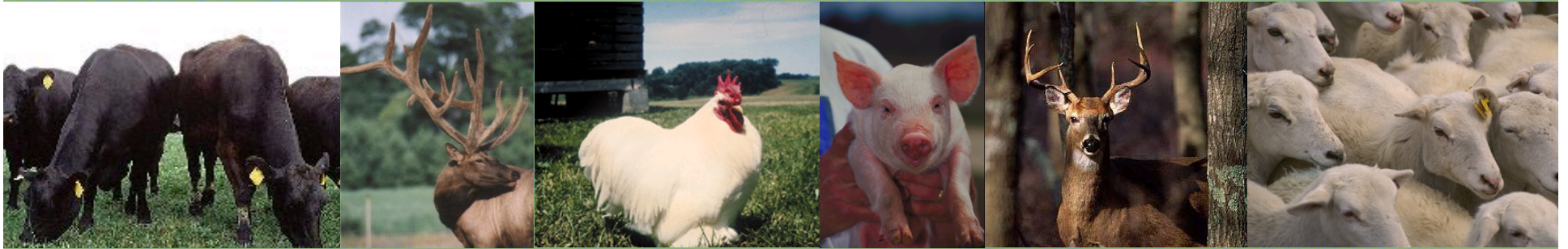
Goats

- Goats must bear an official individual identification unless it is:
 - A neutered goat under 12 months of age

- USDA Scrapie Tag
- USDA NUES Tag 9 digit alphanumeric
- USDA 840 US Origin Tag
- Official Registration Tattoo

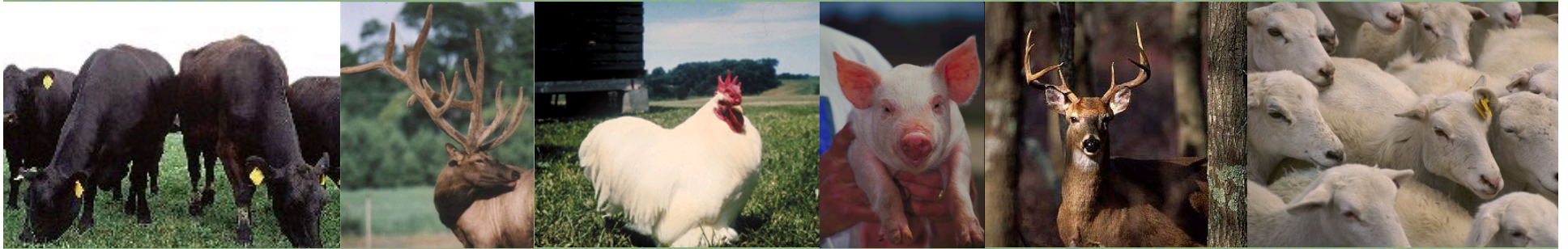


Swine Requirements

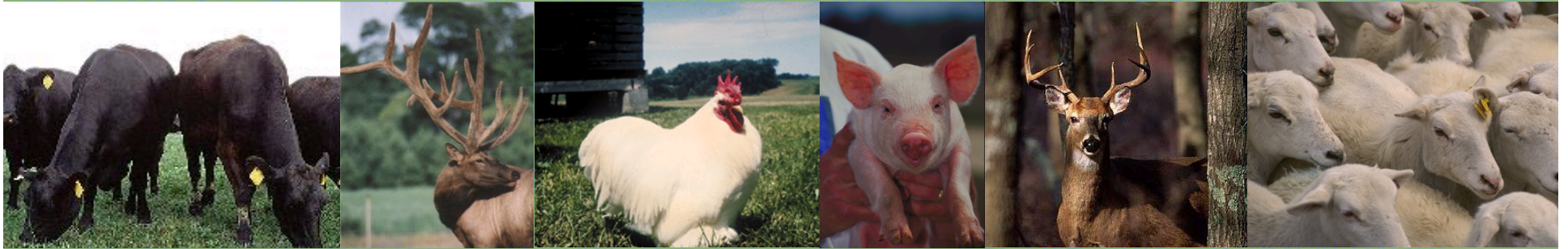
- Certificate of Veterinary Inspection
 - Herd of origin inspected
 - No apparent disease in herd in past 30 days
 - Negative PRV test or swine are from a PRV stage IV or V state



- General Risk Management Recommendations
 - Veterinarian on call
 - Develop a plan for disease identification and response
 - Hold terminal shows after breeding animal shows
 - Educate exhibitors and animal caretakers about flu transmission

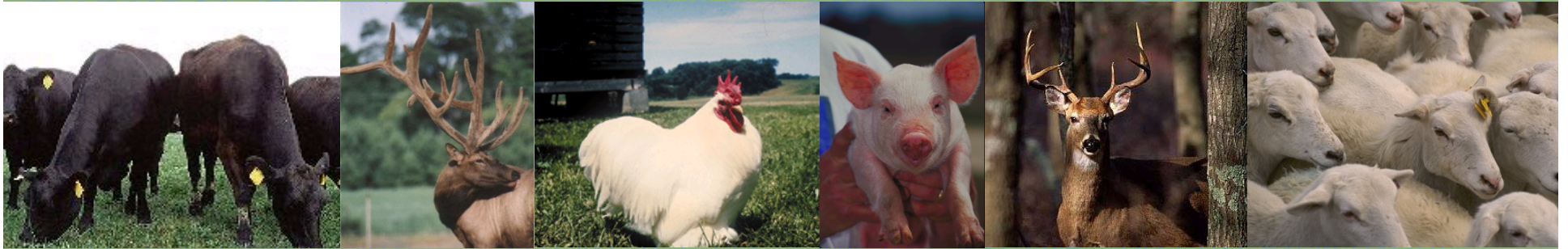


- General Risk Mgmt. Recommendations (cont.)
 - Discourage the following in swine areas:
 - Eating, drinking, smoking
 - Food and drinks
 - Pacifiers, baby bottles, drink cups, utensils
 - Sleeping
 - Adequate hand-washing stations available
 - Barn hygiene and maintenance in public areas



■ Influenza Risk Management Recommendations

- **Vaccination:** Require vaccination within 120 days of opening day. Do not allow unvaccinated swine into the exhibition.
- **Length of stay and multiple shows:** Limit stays to not more than 72 hours and allow 7 or more days between shows.
- **Barn monitoring:** Observe pigs 2-3 times daily for sickness. Isolate sick pigs and consult with a veterinarian to determine if pig should remain on premises.

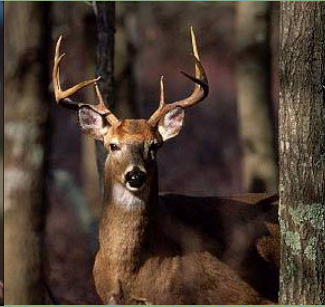
