New Volunteer Training

Volunteers In Preparation

Are you a new leader?

To be recognized as a 4-H volunteer in the Wisconsin 4-H Youth Development program, all adults ages 18 years and older must complete the Volunteers In Preparation (VIP) training. The purpose of this training is to ensure the safety and well-being of all participants. VIP training is step 4 of 4 to become a certified leader in 4-H.

Steps to become a certified 4-H leader:

- 1. Enroll on 4-Honline to become a leader
- 2. Complete background check
- Complete the Mandated Reporter training found on 4-H online.
- 4. Complete Volunteers In Preparation training
- *Once you have completed **ALL** of these steps then you are considered a certified 4-H leader.

Returning leaders, consider attending for a refresher.

Hosting Seijuro Hayashi this past summer was exciting, fun and educational.

All of us enjoyed showing Seijuro how we care for the rabbits we raise and to ensure the health and well being of the new bunnies and chicks that hatched while he was here. He continues to email us requesting pictures of the dogs, rabbits and chickens to watch them grow.

Even though the language barrier was drastic, Siejuro and our family were able to teach and learn from each other of how he does things in Japan as opposed to how we do it here.

We were able to teach him how Rhys had to care for and train his rabbit that he showed at the Lincoln

County Fair and Seijuro was able to see the payoff of that work during the judging in the rabbit barn.

We continue to email Seijuro, which prior to this experience would not have given us the opportunity for a foreign penpal for Rhys.

Water Action Volunteers (WAV) is a statewide program for Wisconsin citizens who want to learn about and improve the quality of Wisconsin's streams and small rivers.
