

Beginner – Exhibitor has had no previous experience in training a dog for agility. Must run course on 6-foot leather lead or with trainer approval may use a pull-tab.  Novice – Exhibitor has had previous experience in training a dog for agility but is now training an untrained dog; or an inexperienced exhibitor is showing a previously trained dog. Must run course on 6-foot leather lead or with trainer approval may use a pull-tab.  Advanced – Exhibitor has experience with the same dog. Must run course on pull-tab.  Graduate Agility – Exhibitor has a more in-depth experience in with the same dog. May not use 6-foot leather lead nor a pull-tab.					



## Rally Obedience (please check one):

Dogs can be exhibited in the same Rally level more than one year based on score earned during the previous year's Lincoln County Fair Dog Show. 95-100 Points: Exhibitors and dogs *must* exhibit in the next class, if available. 85-94 Points: Exhibitors and dogs *may* exhibit in the next class or remain in the

present class.

84 or Fewer Points: Exhibitors and dog *must remain* in the same class and are ineligible for a medallion in obedience.

2019 Score
Recommendation: Pass To Next LevelYour ChoiceRemain In Current Level
Novice Rally: This is the first level for those just getting started. All exercises are performed with the dog on 6-foot leather leash. There is a requirement of 10-15 stations to complete with no more than five stationary exercises. The exercises performed vary from turning 360 degrees to changing paces during the course. Exhibitors at this level may clap their hands and pat their legs through the course.
Level A – Exhibitor has no previous experience in rally obedience.
Level B – Exhibitor has had previous experience in training a dog for rally, but is now training an untrained dog, or an inexperienced exhibitor is showing a previously trained dog, or based on standard of points from previous show.
<u>Advanced Rally</u> – This is the second level, which includes more difficult exercises throughout the course. All exercises are performed off-leash. There is a requirement of 12-17 stations with no more than seven stationary exercises. Exercises include a jump as well as calling your dog to the front of you instead of to a heel position.
Exhibitor has some experience in rally obedience with the same dog and achieved a standard of points.
<u>Excellent</u> - This third and highest level of rally is most challenging. Exercises are performed off-leash except for the honor exercise. There is a requirement of 15-20 stations, with no more than seven stationary exercises. Handlers are only allowed to encourage their dogs verbally. Physica encouragement is not allowed at this level. The Excellent-level exercises include backing up three steps, while the dog stays in the heel position and a moving stand, while the handler walks around the dog.
Exhibitor has experience in rally obedience with the same dog and achieved a standard of points.

# Dog Project Code of Conduct and Expectations (Completed on-line in 2020)

The following guidelines will be enforced to provide a safe, positive experience for all youth involved in the project:

- Youth need to be paying attention to their dog and keep enough space between your dog and other dogs for safety. It has worked to keep dogs at least 6 feet apart to avoid safety issues. The committee recommends that youth follow this guideline for their safety and their dog.
- It is the discretion of the lead trainer to ask an aggressive/uncontrollable dog and/or a youth who is not paying attention to their dog or mistreating their dog to leave/not allow back to trainings and to fair show. This is not meant to discourage individuals from bringing your dog to trainings, but if your dog continually shows aggression or is uncontrollable you will be asked to leave and not allowed back with that dog for the safety of everyone involved in the project. We will place a ribbon on dog/handler combination that are of concern.
- Female dogs that are not spayed are not allowed at trainings or the fair show if they are in season. If you are not sure if your dog is in season, please have your dog checked by a vet the day of training to be sure. The youth is encouraged to come to trainings without their dog to keep up on what is being covered during the training.
- Dogs that pee on/in agility equipment will be required to wear a diaper for trainings and fair show or they will not be allowed to use the equipment. The youth is responsible for providing the diaper for their dog.

I have read and agree to abide by the above guidelines during my participation in dog project trainings and the Lincoln County Fair Dog Show.
