Let's Make an Appreciation Wreath

Taking time to notice and appreciate the good things in our life can help us feel better and more positive.



We tend to take for granted the simplest yet most important things in our world. Using appreciation strategies gives us a new perspective. When we take the time to appreciate something, we focus on something positive, making our brain less able to focus on the negative. Appreciation helps us cope and deal with stress, worry, challenging situations, sadness, and other distressing thoughts and emotions. It elevates our mood and helps us gain a more positive outlook on life. It even helps prevent depression.

Think of appreciation as taking a vitamin — it helps prevent negative thoughts and emotions, but it takes practice to learn to do it regularly.

Gather your Supplies:

Two sheets of hearts; one pink, one white (Included) Piece of ribbon for a hanger Glue, glue stick or tape Scissors Something to write or draw with; pen, pencil, crayons, ANYTHING

Make the Wreath:

Think about appreciating things in life through our five senses sight, hearing, smell, taste and touch. For example, appreciating the beauty of nature, sounds such as laughter or music, sensations such as a warm breeze, as well as the smell and tastes of good food. Taking time out to appreciate things in life is another part of taking care of yourself.

On the hearts provided, write items that you appreciate in your life (big and small, people, things, experiences, etc.). You can do this after you have the wreath assembled by adding the things you appreciate each day or as you think of them.

Cut out the hearts and glue them together to form the wreath.

Use the ribbon to add a hanger to the back of the wreath.

Hang your wreath in a spot you will see on a regular basis as a way to help you focus on the good things in your life.

COVID-19 Vaccine Information from the Lincoln County Health Department

COVID-19 vaccines are being given to healthcare personnel, long-term care facilities, first responders, and those 65 and older at this time. Updates on the COVID-19 vaccine can be found at our the Lincoln County Health Department website *www.lincolncountyhealthdepartment.com*, by calling their vaccine message line at 715-539-

1375, or by emailing the department at *COVID@co.lincoln.wi.us*. To keep our community safe, even once you have had COVID-19 or have been vaccinated, it is important to continue to wear your mask, practice physical distancing, wash your hands often, and stay home when you are sick. The Lincoln County Health Department provides up-to-date information.

ALL items, including Bonus Category, must be pre-registered. Registration is due August 1, 2021. Any items NOT pre-registered will NOT be judged or displayed. Only one entry on each registration form. Send all forms together immediately after county show including written entries. A County may enter a total of 12 entries plus one Bonus Category 20. A county cannot have duplicate entries in any lettered sub-category. The County Cultural Arts Chair must include a self-addressed postcard or email address to verify receipt of registration forms. If you do not receive verification within three weeks, please call or email the WAHCE Cultural Arts Chair.

IMPORTANT: **All entrants MUST sign the Registration form.** Please read and sign below; entries will NOT be accepted if unsigned. Entrants will not hold WAHCE responsible for any loss or damage to any item submitted for use in the WAHCE Cultural Arts Show. Entrants give permission for their photo, photos of their entry, and/or print copies of their written entry to be used by WAHCE as seen fit.

All work must be done by entrant and completed after last year's county show. It must receive a first place at this year's county show or fair. All items must be clean or laundered or will be disqualified by the judge. Kits and patterns may be used as long as entrant does all the work. All easels must have securely taped label with name, county and district.
