All entries must be turned into the Extension 4-H Office by September 26th,

2022. Poster entries will be displayed during 4-H week () and will be judged at the October 4-H Board of Directors meeting.

Poster Requirements:

- Poster Board—Any color
- Size—14" x 22" (Vertical or Horizontal) •
- 4-H Clover—Do not place anything over it. Must be only in green, black or gold/yellow.
- Contact information—Website (bit.ly/LincolnCounty4H or phone • number (715-539-1072)

Helpful Advice:

- Theme: "#Opportunity4All" Does the poster attract attention? Is the message brief and direct?
- Simplicity: Is the poster limited to one idea and readable at a glance?
- **Originality:** Does the poster convey and original idea? An common • idea in a new way?
- Appearance: Is the poster well balanced and neatly done? Does it cover the whole board? Is it free from smudges? Do the images need outlining? Step back 8-10 feet, can you read it and can you still see what all the pictures are?

- All displays must be visible for the public to see (front yards, store windows, lobby displays, etc.) the entire week of October 2-8. (They can be inside or outside.)
- Displays will be judged at the October meeting of the 4-H Board of Directors.
- Only one (1) display per family and/or club may be entered. (A family may do their own display, plus help their club make one.)
- Displays will be judged on eye appeal, neatness, originality and conveying a clear message about the Lincoln County 4-H Centennial.



Displays must remain up the entire week of Oct 2-8.

Who Will You Nominate?

<u>Friend of 4-H Award</u> - Each year, Lincoln County 4-H recognizes one or two community people (non 4-H leaders) who have helped 4-H in the past year(s). Any 4-H member, parent or leader may submit a nomination for the award. Past recipients were noted for special project workshops, providing space and support for 4-H promotional activities, donations of time and money, for politically supporting the 4-H program, etc.

<u>4-H Volunteer Leader Awards</u> - Each year, Lincoln County 4-H, along with the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation will present two different Volunteer Recognition Awards. The Volunteer of the Year Award for individuals who have served as a 4-H Volunteer for less than 10 years and the Lifetime Volunteer Award for individuals who have served 10 or more years. Any 4-H member, parent or leader may nominate a 4-H Volunteer leader for these awards. The 4-H Board of Directors decided at their June 2004 Board meeting that a person is eligible to receive this award previously can be nominated again as long as it has been 5 years since they received the award. The selection is made by a committee of non 4-H adults based on what is shared on the nomination form, so please be complete and thorough.

Forms for both of these awards are available on the 4-H website at bit.ly/Lincoln4HAdultAwards, or from the Extension office.

Nominations are due by October 10th. Nominating person(s) will be asked to make the presentation at the Lincoln County 4-H Celebration on October 22..

Youth Enrollment Deadlines

(To show at the Lincoln County Fair in the Jr. Division)

November 1st

Deadline for re-enrollments to join 4-H and still be able to exhibit at the county fair in Junior Division as a 4-H member. (If a youth has been absent/inactive as a 4-H member for more than 12 months, they would be considered a new member upon joining 4-H again.)

March 1st

Deadline for new members to join 4-H and still be able to exhibit at the county fair in the Junior Division.

<u>May 1st</u>

Last date to change (add or drop) a project. Youth must be enrolled in the project by this date to exhibit in that project area at the county fair in Jr. Division.

<u>July 15th</u>

This deadline is set by the Lincoln County Fair. Fair information and the Fair Entry Book can be found at the Lincoln County Fair website: www.lincolndofair.com

Youth can enroll/re-enroll in Lincoln County 4-H at ANY TIME.

All enrolled youth can participate in Lincoln County 4-H programs and projects. The above deadlines apply only for eligibility to show in the Junior Division at the Lincoln County Fair.
