GRADES 3-12 SUMMER 2024 LOCATION TO BE ANNOUNCED

County 4-H teams compete at district dairy judging contests during regional Area Animal Science Days for the chance to attend the State 4-H Dairy Judging Contest. State winners in the senior division go on to represent Wisconsin at the All-American Dairy Show in Harrisburg, PA, World Dairy Expo in Madison, WI, and the North American International Livestock Exposition in Louisville, KY.

STATE LIVESTOCK JUDGING

GRADES 3-12 SUMMER 2024 LOCATION TO BE ANNOUNCED

The State Livestock Judging Contest selects our state winners for National Competition. The top senior team travels to Louisville, KY. The second-place senior team travels to Denver, CO. The teams that compete at State Livestock Judging previously qualified at the district Area Animal Science Days throughout the state.

MEATS JUDGING

GRADES 3-12 SPRING 2024 LOCATION TO BE ANNOUNCED

This contest tests the knowledge of youth in the placement of carcass and retail cut classes, carcass grading, retail cut identification, and a quiz. This contest occurs annually with the top teams traveling to Kansas City, MO and Denver, CO for national competition.

4-H LIVESTOCK QUIZ BOWL & SKILLATHON

GRADES 3-12 DATES TO BE ANNOUNCED LOCATION TO BE ANNOUNCED

Livestock Quiz Bowl is a quiz competition with questions about beef, sheep, swine, and meat goat topics. Teams of students buzz in to orally answer questions given by a moderator.

The Skillathon contest includes a written quiz and learning stations such as breed identification, feed identification, equipment identification, and team activities such as demonstrating evaluation skills. The top senior level 4-H team will represent Wisconsin at the National 4-H Skillathon Contest, held each Fall in Louisville, KY.

AG SUMMIT GRADES 9-12 DATES TO BE ANNOUNCED WASHINGTON, D.C.

The National 4-H Youth Summit for Agri-Science brings together teen agriculture and science leaders from across the country to focus on learning about and solving current agri-science issues. Students work with each other and experts in the agricultural community to develop a community change project to initiate in their state. Members are nominated for this experience locally by staff and then selected to attend through a state level process.

4-H DAIRY QUIZ BOWL GRADES 3-12 DATES TO BE ANNOUNCED LOCATION TO BE ANNOUNCED

This contest provides an educational dairy program for all dairy project members, including those who may not own a dairy project animal, and provides a way to develop alertness, self-confidence, teamwork skills, and mastery in the area of dairy science.

Teams of four members compete with each other in giving oral answers to questions posed by a moderator.



STATE 4-H DOG AGILITY SHOW GRADES 4-12 AUGUST 26, 2023 CANINE SPORTS ZONE, MIDDLETON, WI

This show includes competitions in agility for dogs and their people. This event is open to youth enrolled in the 4-H Dog Project. Dogs of different levels of abilities and training are welcome.

STATE 4-H DOG OBEDIENCE AND SHOWMANSHIP SHOW THERE WILL BE NO SHOW IN 2023, HOWEVER WE HOPE TO BRING BACK AN AMAZING SHOW IN 2024!

The show includes competitions in obedience and showmanship for the dogs and a variety of other activities for their people such as public speaking and demonstrations, art shows, and a Dog Quiz Bowl. The show is open to youth enrolled in the 4-H Dog Project.

Gymkhana is an annual horse and pony competition, featuring speed pattern racing events including: Cloverleaf Barrels, Flag Race, Plug Race, Pole Bending, LT Special, and Key Races.

4-H HUNT & DRESSAGE SHOW GRADES 6-13 DATES TO BE ANNOUNCED

SHEBOYGAN COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS

4-H Hunt and Dressage Show is a 3-day event featuring dressage clinics and show, over fences clinics and show, and flat and pleasure classes. Youth can attend educational clinics and showcase their skills in a variety of individual and group dressage classes.



STATE 4-H HORSE EDUCATION DAYS, HORSE BOWL, & HIPPOLOGY CONTEST GRADES 3-13

DATES TO BE ANNOUNCED DODGE COUNTY FAIRGROUNDS

State Horse Education Days occurs annually in June and provides an opportunity for youth in grades 3-13 enrolled in the 4-H Horse Project to demonstrate their knowledge of equine-related subject matter in a competitive setting. Youth answer questions in teams of 3-4 members and compete against other teams in the same class. These events consist of quiz-style questions about the following topics: Nutrition and Feed, Health and Diseases, History, Evolution and Breeds, Reproduction and Genetics.

STATE HORSE EXPO GRADES 3-12

SEPTEMBER 15-17, 2023 STATE FAIR PARK, WEST ALLIS, WI

State 4-H Horse Expo is an annual event for all youth enrolled in the 4-H Horse Program and draws crowds of over 900 youth and 700 horses. Youth participate in a wide variety of competitions and projects including a live horse show, horse judging, and different arts and educational projects about horses.

AWARDS & SCHOLARSHIPS KEY AWARDS



The Wisconsin 4-H Key Award Program is one of the highest recognitions a 4-H member can receive. This award recognizes a select group of 4-H participants who have demonstrated consistent growth in their 4-H involvement, developed and applied their leadership skills, and actively participated in the functions of their 4-H club and community. To be eligible, candidates for this award must be in grade 9 or older, and must have completed at least three years of 4-H and one year of youth leadership.

CROWLEY DAIRY LEADERSHIP AWARD

The 4-H Dairy Leadership Award provides recognition to youth who have excelled in their Dairy Project. Eligibility for this award includes: current enrollment in the 4-H Dairy Project and have at least two previous years of membership, must be in grades 10-13 as of January 1, and should have an outstanding record of involvement and accomplishments in the 4-H Dairy Project.

Fifteen (15) state-level awards are to be presented annually to outstanding 4-H Dairy Project members. Award plaques will be given to the top fifteen and the top three youth will each receive \$1,000 cash awards. Youth that have received a plaque only are encouraged to apply again.

Additionally, the top 4-H member that is a Junior in high school as of January 1, 2024 will be offered a \$5,000 scholarship to attend the University of Wisconsin-Madison and enroll in the Department of Dairy and Animal Sciences.

WISCONSIN 4-H FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation awards scholarships to outstanding Wisconsin 4-H members and alumni pursuing higher education in 2024. Wisconsin 4-H Foundation scholarships are awarded to students based on demonstrated personal growth through 4-H, development and leadership in 4-H, academic performance, and future educational goals. Applicants who are awarded scholarships will be notified by postal letter and email in May.
